**RE: Public hearings and meetings on primary or Election Day**

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We have received many inquiries as to whether public hearings or meetings are permitted on Election Day. The following are the *only public meetings that must not be held on Election Day*.

1. All public hearing held under Zoning Act by city councils, planning boards, and boards of appeals. G. L. c. 40A § 11 (2004 ed.)<sup>1</sup>
2. Public hearings by the State Department of Community Affairs on low-rent public housing projects. G. L. c. 121B § 31 (2004 ed.)

All other public hearings and meetings appear to be permitted on Election Day, although we do not recommend holding them on the day of the election.
